International Judge

Clean Sport

Beauty products and supplements

In the past year, two athletes were found to have committed anti-doping rule violations for the presence of the prohibited substance sibutramine, which was ingested either through contaminated nutritional supplements or beauty products.

The disciplinary panels found that the athletes took the substance unintentionally. However, according to World Anti-Doping Agency principles, athletes are responsible for any substances they ingest.



World Archery has issued an anti-doping notice to remind athletes to check the contents of any supplement or product and strongly consider the possible implications of consumption.

Indoor world record

The Italian compound women's team of Marcella Tonioli, Irene Franchini and Laura Longo scored 237 out of a possible 240 points during their semifinal at the 2017 World Archery Europe Indoor Championships to set a new team matchplay world record by a point. The previous world-best mark of 236 points had been set at the world indoors in Poland in 2009 by the USA.

Brazilian recurve women Ane Marcelle Dos Santos, who was the highest domestic finisher in the archery competition at the last Olympic Games, was named athlete of the year by the Brazilian Olympic Committee for her performance at Rio 2016. A total of 43 athletes were awarded trophies at a ceremony in the City of Arts, in Rio de Janeiro, celebrating the achievements of Brazil's athletes and thanking everyone involved in staging the Games.

Korea

Korea has announced its eight-strong men's and women's recurve squads for the 2017 season. Ku Bonchan, reigning individual Olympic Champion from Rio 2016, will not shoot internationally in 2017 after failing to make the eight-man Korean squad at the first of two national selection stages.

Events

Vittel 2017

The Italian team led the medal table at the 2017 World Archery Europe Indoor Championships. Olympian David Pasqualucci won recurve men's gold, and Jacopo Polidori beat out world number one Mike Schloesser for the compound men's title, as Italy's archers secured 10 total medals at the championship.

Athens 2004 Olympic Champion Marco Galiazzo lost the recurve men's bronze medal match but, with Pasqualucci and Mandia, picked up team gold.

Italy won further gold medals in the recurve junior women's team and individual events, had the second-placed compound junior men's, junior women's and women's squads – and Marcella Tonioli won individual compound women's bronze.

Ukraine's Veronika Marchenko won the recurve women's European indoor title, while Alexandra Savenkova, from Russia, took gold in the compound women's competition.

Bangkok 2017

The Asia Cup stage in Bangkok, Thailand acted as the Asian continental and final qualification tournament for the 2017 World Games in Wroclaw, Poland – awarding three men's and three women's places in the compound archery competition to top finishers. Iran booked places for both genders after Esmaeil Ebadi and Parisa Baratchi each took individual gold medals.



Philippines archer Amaya Amparo Cojuangco's second place and Chinese Taipei's Chen Yi-Hsuan's third secured the women's tickets.

Chinese Taipei led the overall medal table, winning all four team competitions and taking four individual medals to take the squad's count to eight in total, including five gold medals.


Event in Belarus

Asian Games 2018

The Olympic Council of Asia has added archery's recurve and compound mixed team events to the Asian Games programme for Jakarta-Palembang 2018, bringing the total number of archery titles available to 10. Until 2010, the Asian Games archery tournament consisted of recurve individual and team events. In Incheon in 2014, compound individual and team events were contested for the first time, sparking a surge in the competitive level of continental athletes in the discipline.

Coaching Education

World Archery seminar

Held every second year, the World Archery Coaching Seminar will celebrate its eighth edition on 27-29 October 2017 at the World Archery Excellence Centre located in Lausanne, Switzerland. These great facilities will allow an attractive format including several practical workshops. More information to follow.

Certified level 1 coach trainer

Despite juggling his national coaching certification programme and World Archery international one, Timothy Swane from UK has successfully completed a level 1 coach trainer accreditation after training held in 2015 by World Archery Europe and Olympic Solidarity. Tim is the chair of Archery GB Coaches Committee and has already submitted the required document for a possible certification at level 2.

Scholarship

An archery coach from Guinea has been granted Olympic Solidarity scholarship to attend the spring session of the Sports Academy Lausanne from 24 April until 16 June 2017. The World Archery development department adds a parallel archery-specific programme in the World Archery Excellence Centre.

International level 2 training

The Israeli Archery Federation hosted an original training event for level 2 archery coaches from 20 February to 4 March 2017. This project, funded by Olympic Solidarity, consisted of a sevenday regular level 2 coaching course, a one-day indoor tournament and a four-day practical clinic, allowing participants the opportunity to use their new knowledge in practise.



The course (19 participants) and clinic (27 participants) were conducted by Pascal Colmaire, World Archery Development and Education Director.

Greece, Ukraine and Vanuatu sent participants for the level 2 coaching course. An evaluation was conducted at the end, and out of 20 points – except for a 10 due to the barrier of writing in English – all participants got a satisfactory score between 12 and 18 points.

Special thanks to Coach Yuri Yogev who organised this training programme at the National Sport Centre of Wingate Institute in Tel Aviv.

Turkey

On 25 March 2017 at the Olympic village in Istanbul, the general assembly of the Turkish Olympic Committee has confirmed World Archery President and IOC Vice President Ugur Erdener in his position as President for a new Olympiad. Prof Dr Erdener has led the NOC since 2011.

Colombia

World Archery Colombia's President Irma Lucia Ruiz G. has been elected as Executive Committee Member of the National Olympic Committee for a four-year term (2017-2012), an important recognition for both the national archery federation and their athletes.

France

Jean-Michel Cleroy, aged 55, was elected as President during the General Assembly of the French Archery Federation held in Paris on 25 March 2017. He succeeds World Archery Vice President Philippe Bouclet who was at the head of the national federation during four Olympiads. Only one list in the running, Cleroy's list called "Let's build together tomorrow's federation" was elected with 83.95 percent of votes.

A convention has been signed between the French Archery Federation and World Archery Americas allowing the French territories of Guadeloupe, Guyana and Martinique to take part to the competition organised in the Caribbean and Central American zone. Furthermore, World Archery Americas is very pleased to announce the affiliation of the Martinique Archery League ("Ligue Martiniquaise de Tir à l'Arc") as an Associate Member.

Japanese Consortium "Sport for Tomorrow"

From April 2018, Sport for Tomorrow sponsor some invitations to athletes from oversea to Japan for training camp and participation in a local competition. Below are some criteria:

- 1. The World Archery member association must be a member its the respective NOC.
- 2. JSC pays for a maximum of 10 people (or less is fine but all members must be athletes, coach, team leader or officials).









- 3. Location of camp must be designated place (in archery case it is National Training Centre* or Saga Prefecture) to ensure the purpose is for making progress to sport in technical seminar or/and participate/observe local competition (not international or national championships).
- 4. JSC pays for 10 days maximum in Japan including arrival and departure day. If more than 10 days is requested, the extra cost must be paid by the member association.
- 5. JSC pays for flight between their nearest home airport to designated airport in Japan for economy class.
- 6. JSC pays for local transportation between airport to Hotel. JSC pays for ticket to observe the competition and entry fee for participating the competition.
- 7. JSC pays for accommodation fee for designated place but maximum of JPY 6,100 per night per person (extra cost must be paid by the member association).
- 8. Meal fee are paid by JSC up to: JPY 600 for breakfast, JPY850 for lunch and JPY1100 for dinner (extra cost must be paid by member association).
- 9. Must have the seminar for Sport for Tomorrow once (about 30min).
- * Use of the National Training Centre is when it is available, which means when the national team is not using it.

WORLD ARCHERY CONSTITUTION AND RULES

Book 4, Chapter 22.4.1

A question was raised by Swiss Archery Association whether the bow risers shown below are permitted in non-signed divisions.

The Constitution and Rules Committee finds the question presented to be within the terms of reference of the Technical Committee after consultation with The Field and 3D Archery Committee. The Constitution and Rules Committee has determined that the following Interpretation of the Technical Committee is not contrary to the existing rules or Congress decisions.

Response from the Technical Committee:

It is the majority decision of the Technical Committee that the secondary sight window style cut out (as shown in the top 3 risers shown the photo examples) is not legal in any non-sighted divisions. The top portion of the second cut out by definition creates a protrusion, therefore contravening all rules associated with non-sighted bow divisions. In a technical application, the corner of the protrusion is within the bows sighting range where it is close enough to the arrow to be useful for aiming as a sighting reference. The bow would be allowed in non-sighted divisions if the archer's view of the sight window is taped to eliminate the appearance of the "corner". A sturdy tape and if necessary a thin strip of card under the tape, placed at an angle to create a natural straight taper along the sight window would be allowable. The taping must ensure the aiming point remains invisible to the archer when shooting and the tape does not mold around that point.

Examples of acceptable taped riser are shown below.
