Athlete of the Month

France's Sebastien Peineau was named the International World Games Association's Athlete of the Month for October 2017 following his historic victory at the 2017 Hyundai World Archery Championships in Mexico City. The 30-year-old compound archer, who spend the last offseason rehabbing an elbow injury, upset world number one and defending champion Stephan Hansen in the final.

Perfect 600

World number one Stephan Hansen became the second person in history after Mike Schloesser to shoot a perfect 600-point indoor ranking round at a world record status tournament in the north of Spain on 4 November 2017. World number three Schloesser, who was compound men's world champion before Hansen, shot the first perfect 18-metre 60-arrow ranking round at the Indoor Archery World Cup stage in Nimes in 2015.

So Chaewon, Choi Bomin and World Archery Champion Song Yun Soo scored a combined 2108 out of a possible 2160 to set a new world record for the compound women's team ranking round at the 2017 Asian Archery Championships in Dhaka, Bangladesh on 26 November. The Korean trio's score was 13 points higher than the previous world-best mark of 2095, shot by the USA in Shanghai in 2011.

Marrakesh 2017

After Mike Schloesser and Stephan Hansen - the only two archers to shoot perfect 600 scores indoors - tied on 599 to lead qualification, it was the USA's Braden Gellenthien that survived the elimination brackets to take compound men's gold in Morocco.

Aida Roman (Mexico) beat Gabriela Bayardo (Mexico but moving to Netherlands) in a shoot-off in the recurve women's final, while Paige Pearce-Gore and Sarah Prieels needed two shootoffs in the compound women's final.

Matteo Fissore, after a run of three silver medals in Marrakesh, finished with recurve men's gold.

Dhaka 2017

India secured a full quota of two - one boy and one girl - to the Buenos Aires 2018 Youth Olympic Games, as DPR Korea and IR Iran (girls), and Thailand and Kazakstan (boys) also picked up places at the Asian continental qualifier.

Korea led the medal table at the Championships, taking all but two gold medals - which were won by India in the compound men's individual event (Abhishek Verma) and compound women's team competition.
