IOC Status

World Archery President Prof Dr Ugur Erdener, who has been a member of the International Olympic Committee since 2008, had his IOC membership status switched from international federation president to individual member at the Session in Pyeongchang on 7 February 2018. This means his IOC position is no longer reliant on his position as World Archery President. Prof Dr Erdener has been World Archery President since 2005 and was re-elected for a fourth consecutive term at the federation's Congress in Mexico City in 2017.

World Archery Awards 2017

The Netherland's Steve Wijler was the big story as World Archery's Athlete of the Year Award winners for 2017 were announced during the 2018 Indoor Archery World Cup Final in Las Vegas, USA on 10 February. In his first international season, Steve Wijler collected both the breakthrough and recurve men's athlete of the year awards. Over 72,000 public votes were cast for the 2017 awards.

European Record

In recurve qualification at the World Archery Indoor World Championships 2018, Sjef van den Berg of the Netherlands set a new European record of 598 out of a possible 600 points, breaking a record that had stood for 17 years, to top the ranking round. Sjef and 20-year-old Yuki Kawata of Japan tied on the score atop the ranking list - setting a new Japanese national record.

World Archery has announced Samsun in Turkey as host of the 2018 Hyundai Archery World Cup Final on 29/30 September. After Istanbul in 2011, it will be the second time the nation hosts the season-ending event. Located on the north coast next to the Black Sea, Samsun joins a long list of iconic hosts of the Hyundai Archery World Cup Final. The 13th season of the annual international circuit will conclude in the historic Turkish city.

The compound open championship shootdown came down to a face-off between Bob Eyler and Lucky Dog Christopher Perkins, as US archers Eyler and Alexis Ruiz took the top two titles at the 52nd edition of The Vegas Shoot, which concluded on 11 January 2018. "Dream come true. Archery-related, that's my dream come true," said first-time winner Eyler, who hadn't shot the event for six years. "If there's any tournament I could choose to win, this would be it."
